



Abraham Weihua Liu was born in the poor country village of Hebei province, China on Nov 14, 1966. From 1986-1990, he studied at Hebei Teachers' University, majoring in English. In May 1989, he was one of the 106 Suicide Squads on Tian An Men Square. In the 1990's, he worked as a tourist guide in Beijing for China Travel Service, taught English at Forestry Technical School and Postal College, and also worked as a free businessman.

But, on Sept 7, 1997, Abraham was saved in Louisiana during a business trip at New Covenant Baptist Church. Soon after this, he felt the call by God to preach. He was arrested twice in 1998, after preaching the Word of God at local house churches in Shijiazhuang and spreading the Gospel at the college where he was employed. By 1999, Abraham became a fulltime Pastor of a local house church called Philadelphia.

From 1999 until 2005, Abraham attended underground seminary by Singaporeans while training house church pastors in six provinces and cities in China. During this time, Abraham's devotion to serving the Lord by ministering and preaching in China meant relocating his home three times due to persecution and being subjected to police surveillance. His wife, Grace Jianhua Liu, was also arrested and beaten for spreading the Gospel in March of 2004. At this time, Abraham also worked for World Teach of Walk through the Bible specializing in Biblical Marriage and Parenting, so that he could train house church leaders from thirteen provinces in Biblical Family and Marriage Counseling.

Abraham studied at The Evangelical Institute of Greenville in South Carolina and was ordained to be a well-equipped missionary working for the Gospel of Christ from 2005-2007. On June 10, 2007, he was installed as the first pastor of the Chinese Christian Church in Clemson, South Carolina. Until late 2011, he shepherded the people of the Chinese Christian Church at Clemson wholeheartedly. Around April 2012, Abraham joined Ambassadors for Christ International-USA for Church Revival and Biblical Marriage & Family Ministry.

However, in September of 2013, according to God's timing, Abraham took his family to visit China as American citizens for two months. In response to this trip, he made a second trip to China in March 2014 traveling through: Hebei, Henan, Shanxi, Zhejiang, Guangxi, Heilongjiang, Jilin, Liaoning and Beijing. This trip revealed the Church of the Book of Acts was not present anymore. Most of the local Chinese house churches became religious and lost passion for the Lord and compassion for the lost. Burdened by the lost people in China, as

one of the hopeless who found hope in Christ, Abraham prayed for four months about how to serve them. Graciously, God gave him the vision for Bridge for Hope entrusting him as a faithful servant in the BFH ministry.

Finally, in February 2015, Abraham took the first BFH team to Shijiazhuang, Hebei to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ to seventy teenagers and school workers and about thirty families, as well as, encouraging over ten local churches. Abraham is still working for a suicide squad but for Christ only.

Abraham met his wife, Grace Jianhua Liu, at the Hebei Teachers' University and were married on October 6, 1990. They have four children: Samuel, John, Joseph, and Joy. Presently, they reside in South Carolina.

Currently, Abraham leads his family to follow and serve the Lord Jesus, not expecting anything from any man, but by faith, totally trusting their merciful Master.
